Enjoy fresh produce and support local agriculture around Harvard

Many of us want to support our community farms but don't know how. This brochure lists local farms that use a Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) model. A CSA asks you to make a financial commitment to the farm (usually early in the growing year) in exchange for a guaranteed weekly share during the growing season. Some CSA farms ask members to work a small number of hours on the farm during the growing season. This spring, consider joining a local CSA and add locally grown produce to your table.

Your trips to your CSA may not seem like much, but they are!

By purchasing directly from local farmers, you are preventing the delegation of food production to farms in far away places. And you are helping re-establish the local food supply that vanished with the onset of a cheap, seemingly endless supply of oil. This growing season, get the freshest food and help local farms and farmers thrive.
